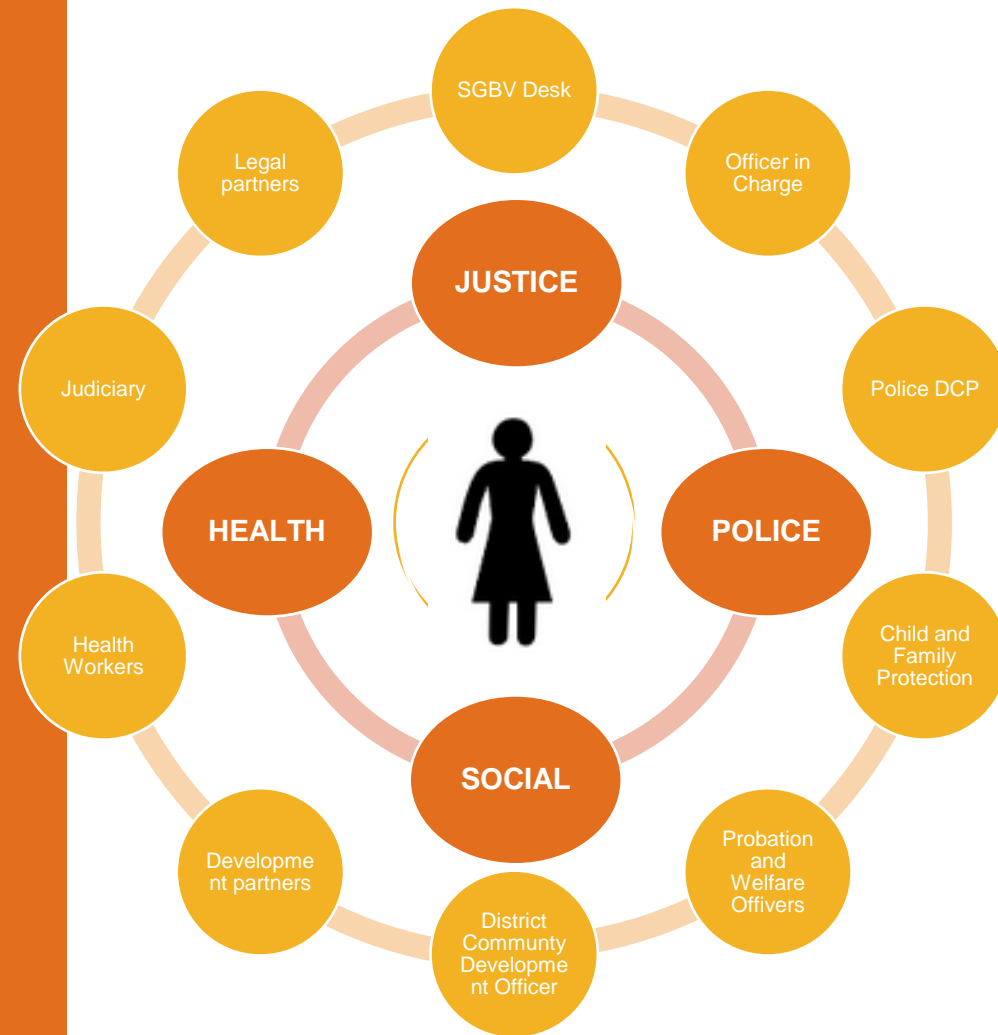
Why case conferences?

Inadequate quality and timeliness of service delivery to GBV survivors, due to:

- Limited collaboration among stakeholders/ service providers
- Duplication of cases (e.g. reporting)
- Lack of common understanding and practice of case management processes



Improved GBV service delivery



Coordination, cooperation and networking of relevant GBV service providers (good practice: combining stakeholders from refugee and host)

Sharing of Expertise and Information: Practice- and solution-oriented
